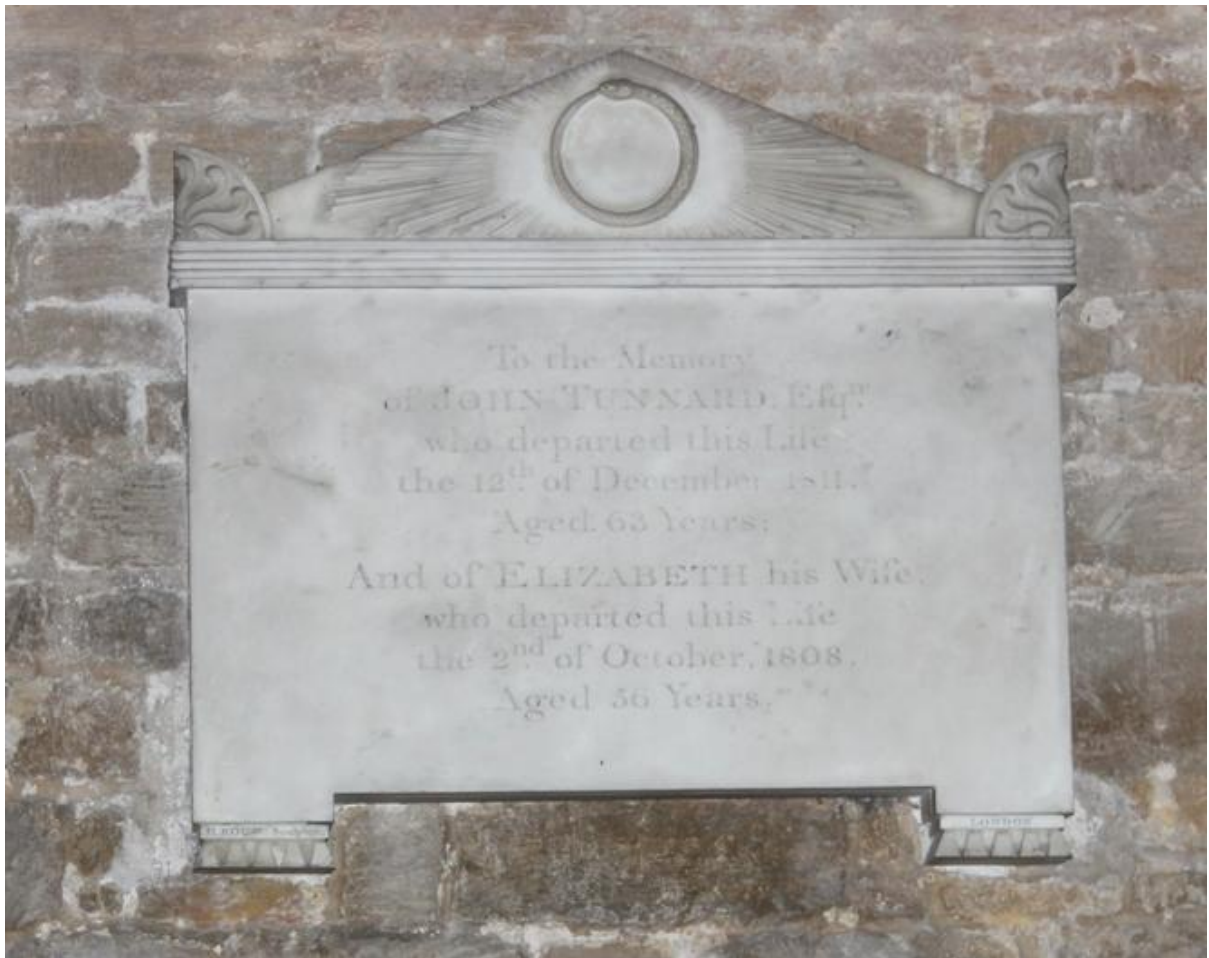


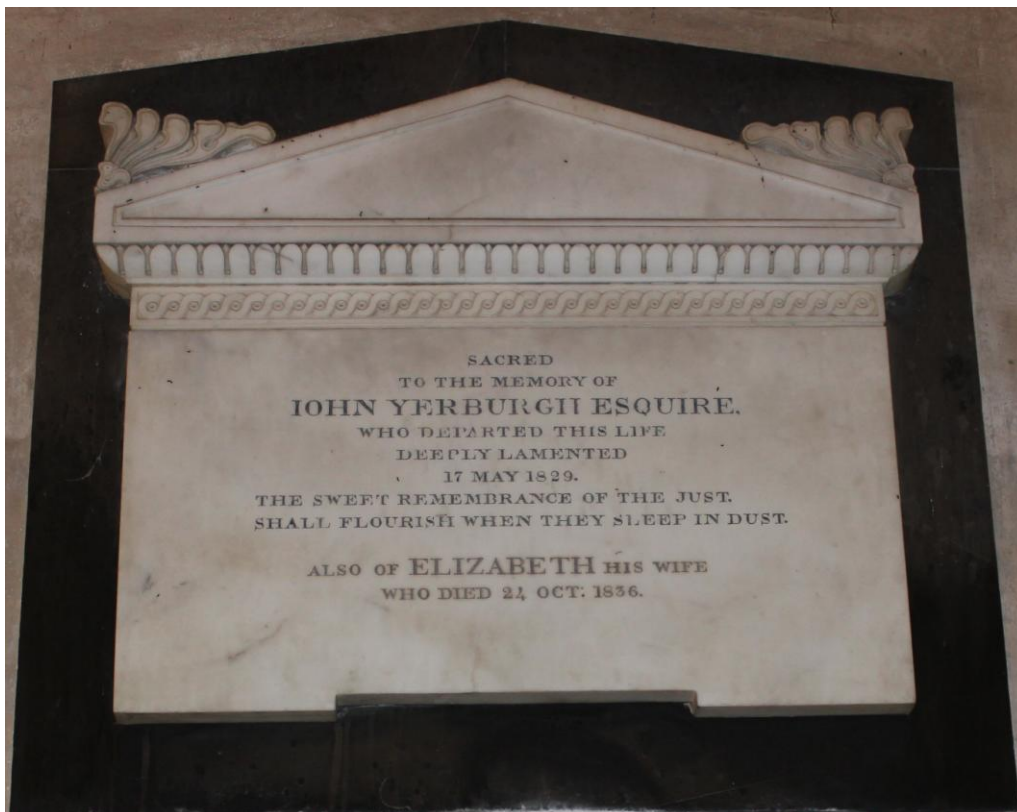




BENEATH THIS CHURCH IN THE FAMILY VAULT
